Rosalind Reed Dwight was an architect active in Portland from 1977 until her untimely death in 1989 at age 39. Her work includes the restoration of the McLoughlin House and Barclay House in Oregon City. She was held in high regard and with deep affection by the Portland design community. This award was created by a group of friends, and funded by the Portland architecture and design community, in her memory. With it come expectations and hope that the honor of the award will aid the recipient in her accomplishments.
