THE VAN EVERA BAILEY FELLOWSHIP

Architecture Foundation of Oregon & The Oregon Community Foundation

Overview

Since 2001, AFO has partnered with The Van Evera and Janet M. Bailey Fund of The Oregon Community Foundation in awarding the now \$25,000 annual Van Evera Bailey Fellowship to advance the professional development of architects and related professionals, encouraging greater contributions to their profession and their community. This Fellowship is an opportunity for professionals in the field to examine not only what they think, but how they think.

Fellowship projects follow a variety of paths, from pure research involving reflection on professional issues and challenges, to practical research involving projects designed to have specific results. Examples of eligible activities include, but are not limited to:

- sabbaticals for study of innovative architectural design to be applied in Oregon
- teaching engagements that promise enhancement of the applicant's and students' creativity in architectural design
- collaborations of architects and planners or others toward the implementation of new projects
- preparation of public education projects; or research and writing on a specific topic

Deadline: Tuesday, October 1, 2019 for projects to begin in January 2020

The award will be announced by December 2019

Eligibility

Eligibility for the Fellowship is flexible. Favorable emphasis will be given to applicants who are licensed architects with practices based in Oregon, and who are at a point of inflection in their career, however professionals from related fields are encouraged to apply. The intention of the Fellowship is to provide time for creativity, reflection and a pursuit of deeper understanding of ideas that will result in lasting value to the applicant, the profession and the greater community.

The Fellowship is intended to promote dissemination and application of ideas. Support may be requested for stipends, travel, lodging, materials, and other relevant needs. Projects must include follow-up activities that in some way shares the results of the Fellowship with the professional community and general public. Fellows will be asked to provide information to document their experience. At the end of the Fellowship, AFO and the Fellow will collaborate on a short professionally produced video highlighting the project and its outcome. This video will be featured on the AFO website, social media outlets and may be utilized to discuss the program in the future.

Applicants may apply jointly for a Van Evera Bailey Fellowship. For example, if an architect and an urban planner see potential for an innovative project that requires unusual research, they might apply jointly for stipends or support of travel and other expenses in order to examine relevant work in other communities, states, or countries; consult with professional peers and leading thinkers; formulate detailed plans; and produce articles or public education programs.

Current members of the board of AFO are not eligible to apply or to receive Fellowship funds indirectly as a partner in a proposed project.

Application Requirements

Interested applicants must submit electronically a PDF copy of the following:

1. Greatest scoring weight will be given to a letter of up to four pages describing the proposed fellowship, clearly outlining:
 - your compelling concept for the Fellowship and a clearly articulated thesis statement question that will guide and frame your work
 - a documented and proven need to be addressed by the Fellowship
 - the potential impact of the project on the applicant, the profession and the community
 - innovative plans for dissemination of the project results- dissemination plans do not need to adhere to any specific criteria and creative communication tools are encouraged
 - applicant's academic, civic and professional qualifications to either study the topic at hand or a justification as to why the study of a specific topic will enrich either the field or their individual work
2. Additional Attachments:
 - the resume of the applicant(s)
 - a work plan and timetable for the completion of the project
 - an itemized budget for the entire Fellowship. If other sources of support will be used to complement Bailey Fund support, please identify them and whether they have been secured. **IMPORTANT NOTE: The award of a Bailey Fellowship is taxable income. Applicants must plan and budget accordingly.**
 - two or three letters of support from different perspectives which may include other architects, architectural organizations, or representatives of other fields, indicating why the proposed Fellowship is important to the professional community. References should address personal capabilities of the applicant and value of the project.
 - Optional: Applicants may include a brief portfolio of materials in PDF format that illuminates their work and its relevance to the proposed project. Portfolio must be included with the application in one PDF file that does not exceed 5 MB.

Entire application should be sent in one PDF file that is no larger than 5 MB to candice@af-oregon.org

Process and Timetable

Applications will be reviewed by a committee including professional architects in collaboration with OCF and AFO. Applicants may be asked to submit further information or to speak with representatives of OCF and AFO to clarify their proposals. The review committee will make recommendations to the board of The Oregon Community Foundation. OCF reserves the right to approve Bailey Fellowships at its sole discretion. The Bailey Fellowship will be awarded by OCF through the Architecture Foundation of Oregon and will be announced publicly by December. The year-long Fellowship period begins January 1 of 2020.
