Day 5 Activity: Now Let's Build a Model!

Choose a building in your future city. You will be constructing a three-dimensional model of this building! Go to page 24 of your **Architect Journal** to get started.

Once you are done building, go to page 25 of your journal and reflect on all the decisions that went into the design of your future city and model.

Think about step 5 in the design process, which is to “improve your design.” Now that you’ve designed your future city, what would you improve? Did your city meet the design criteria from Day 4? Is everyone in your city able to live by the Kid’s Rights from Day 3? It’s impossible to get everything right the first time, which is why it’s called the design process. There is always room for improvement!
