


# 2022 Impact Report

# Educate

## Cultivating creativity in our communities

AFO believes that all Oregonians benefit from thoughtful design in their homes, in their community, and in the environment around them. Through dynamic programming, AFO works with community partners to share design's role in shaping our future.

### Educational Programs

**Architects in Schools** pairs design professionals with elementary school teachers to teach students the importance of design for all people, the power of collaboration, and creative problem solving.

**Scholarships** for students pursuing degrees in architecture and allied fields support access to higher education. The Hatfield Architectural Award and William Hart Scholarship support Oregon architecture students with a specific focus on increasing access to the field for underserved students.

### 2022 Educational Accomplishments

**Trauma-Informed Workshops** are hosted by a facilitator and available for all staff, volunteers, and board members so we can better serve our communities.

**PCC/AFO Architecture & Interior Design Scholarship** established for first-generation architecture and interior design students at Portland Community College.

**Tsagaglalal (She Who Watches) Scholarship** established for Native American, Alaskan Native, and Hawaiian Native students pursuing art or architecture degrees at Portland State University.

## Convening dynamic conversations across Oregon

AFO partners with organizations across the state to connect communities with the power of design. By convening conversations and encouraging involvement, we empower people to embrace design as a tool to impact Oregon for generations to come.

### Engagement Programs

**Fellowships** provide an opportunity for design and building professionals to deepen their understanding of design's role in creating an Oregon where everyone can thrive.

**REFRESH** is a jovial networking opportunity in a casual setting for industry professionals, especially young and mid-level individuals working to advance their career prospects.

### 2022 Engagement Accomplishments

**Pat Sanchez Women's Fellowship** in partnership with Opsis Architecture, supports mid-career women looking to expand upon their work and professional development with an up to \$3,000 award.

**Oregon Student Opportunities Hub** is a web resource connecting Kindergarten to Post-Secondary students to architecture, engineering, construction, and design engagement opportunities across Oregon.

## Sparking ideas that broaden our world




